

Big Idea: Those who will rein with Christ forever are only those who long to be near to Him today.

1.) Am I really ? (v. 14-15).

- -- In the title "the Amen," Christ reminds the church that He alone is humanity's ultimate, infallible, and authoritative judge.
- -- As the "faithful and true Witness" Jesus always tells us the even when (especially when) we don't want to hear it.
- -- Everyone who longs for eternal life will listen carefully to the words of Him in whom it is not only its beginning, but also its "Amen."

2.) What am I making? (v. 15-16)

- -- Both cold and hot are good here, because they are mentioned in reference to .
- -- A faith that makes no impact for the kingdom and glory of God is like lukewarm water to the mouth (1 Corinthians 12:27, James 2:17-18).
- -- Christ responds to lukewarm followers as we tend to respond to lukewarm water—He "spits them out of His mouth."
- -- Are we giving off the flavor of heaven, or is our witness to a watching world like lukewarm water that repels rather than recruits?

3.) How ______ am I repenting? (v. 17).

- -- There was an immense chasm between the Laodiceans and their true spiritual condition.
- -- The Laodicean church members rejoiced in their spiritual condition when they should have been repenting.
- -- We should avoid the temptation to examine our spiritual condition from our own perspective, and strive to see ourselves through Christ's eyes.
- -- Lukewarm Christians suffer from a self-deceived spirituality that keeps them satisfied with unrighteousness.
- -- Self-righteousness has tremendous power to inflict outrageous measures spiritual blindness in the human heart and mind.

4.) What am I sincerely ? (v. 18-19)

- -- Laodicea had acquired its material wealth from three primary sources banking, textiles, and the production of a popular eye salve.
- -- The will of Christ for the church is that the spiritual poverty brought about by our sin would be replaced by wealth.
- -- The only place we can get these spiritual riches is from Jesus himself. So, He says, "I counsel you to buy from me."
- -- Since sin has made us bankrupt, how are we supposed to afford gold, white *garments, or salve from Christ?*

5.) Am I letting the in?

- -- The only thing we can offer Christ in exchange for eternal riches from Him is the of an open heart.
- -- This call to open the door of the heart to Christ is not addressed directly to unbelievers, but to lukewarm, self-satisfied Christians.
- -- Disengagement from the Lord is the habit of people who are inhospitably satisfied to leave Him on the doorstep knocking.
 - -- Distance from Christ and His Word dissipates our passion for Him.
 - -- Are we habitually maintaining close fellowship with the Lord, or do we keep Him on the doorstep?
 - -- Is Jesus a close companion with whom you share rich spiritual meals? Or do you treat Him more like a distant deity for special occasions?

The Key Application

- -- In His love for us, Christ summons us to earnestly of every measure of self-righteous or self-satisfied pride.
- -- Seek your heart for lukewarm faith, and then invite the Lord come in and make refresh your faith once again.

- -- Christ offers a share in His universal and everlasting rule to those who, by grace, overcome the perils of self-satisfied religion and lukewarm faith.
