

## Big Idea: Our purpose in life is to worship and to witness.

- ~ The Book of Revelation first existed as a letter written to particular people who lived in a particular context.
- ~ The seven churches here are given as a \_\_\_\_\_ of all churches in every age of the earth.

## ~ John sends this greeting from the \_\_\_\_\_

~ v. 4a – A greeting from God the Father, whom John identifies as "Him who is and who was and is to come."

~ v. 4b - A greeting from the \_\_\_\_\_

whom John identifies as "the seven spirits who are before his throne." ~ Isaiah 11:1-3, Zechariah 4:1-10, Revelation 1:20, 4:5, 5:6).

- ~ v. 5 A greeting from the Jesus Christ, whom John identifies as "the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth."
- ~ In verses 4-8, John impresses upon his hearers the tremendous purpose we have in and through Christ and in His second coming.

## 1.) Be a \_\_\_\_\_.

- ~v. 5 "the faithful witness" (Isaiah 55, Psalm 89, John 18:37)
  - ~ Since our Savior's mission on Earth was to bear witness to the truth, should it not also be the mission of His servants?
  - ~ We have been won to Christ to witness for Christ. We have been saved to speak.
- ~v. 6 "who ... made us ... priests to his God and Father."
  - ~ Above all, our appointment as \_\_\_\_\_\_ of God is a calling to witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:9).
  - ~ We serve as priests of God by bearing witness to the Gospel and summoning the lost to faith in Christ.

## 2.) Be a \_\_\_\_\_.

- Immediately after the Trinitarian greeting (v. 4-5a) comes a meant to summon us to worship.
  - ~ To receive this letter as it is written and to understand what it really reveals is to shout the praises penned by John in v. 4-7.
  - ~ Much more than a merely optional call to worship, this doxology comes also as a \_\_\_\_\_ command (v. 7).
- ~ Make it your highest ambition to live each day as an earnest worshipper of God.
- ~ In these the two purposes of the church—to worship and witness—we see the two Great Commandments from a new angle (Matthew 22:37-39).
- ~ We will know that we understand the Book of Revelation if we are inspired through it to worship and to witness.
