

Big Idea: Be dedicated to truth and determined to love.

Introduction

- -- Today's text is the first of seven letters that Christ writes to seven churches.
- -- In the course of these seven letters, Jesus gives us a powerful picture of what the church is supposed to be about.
- -- The religious atmosphere in Ephesus was an "anything goes" kind of paganism.
- -- There is a 7-part pattern to each of the seven letters in Revelation 2-3: (1) Command to write, (2) Characterization of Christ, (3) Commendation of the Church, (4) Complaint against the Church (5) Cure for the Church, (6) Consequence for Disobedience (7) Covenant for Conquerors
- -- Three things we need to be doing as the church of Jesus Christ...

1.) Work ______ (v. 2-3).

(v. 2b, 6).

- -- Jesus commends the church at Ephesus for its reputation of diligence, perseverance, and grit.
- -- Christ takes pleasure in those who work diligently for Him (Ephesians 2:10, Acts 20:35, 1 Corinthians 15:10).

2.) Hate _

- -- Jesus very commends the church in Ephesus on account of their intolerance for false teachers (v. 2b).
 - -- Do you hate false doctrines and the deceptions they bring?
 - -- It is a godly thing to be intolerant of false teaching.

-- Jesus commends the church's ______ of immorality (v. 6).

- -- The Nicolaitans taught that, because Christians are saved by grace, we are free to live however we want.
- -- Jesus commends the church in Ephesus because it hated the immorality of the Nicolaitans and refused to allow it into the church.
- -- True godliness ______ that we hate what God hates (Psalm 97:10, Proverbs 13:5).
- -- Jesus does not want us to address our weaknesses by diminishing our strengths.

3.) Love _____ (v. 4).

- -- The good they were doing was at risk of being disbanded because of they had abandoned their mandate to love.
 - -- Lack of love is an extreme flaw, as is clear from the extreme consequence Jesus threatens in v. 5.
 - -- The Christians in Ephesus cared deeply about God's truth, but they didn't properly for each other.
- -- When we lose our passion for people, we forfeit our in this world as the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 13:1-3, 1 John 4:8).
 - -- Internally, a church that has lost its love is bound to experience a lack of close fellowship within the church.
 - -- Externally, a church that has lost its love will increasingly fail to engage the world outside of its walls.

- 2.) Repent of loveless living and ask God will renew your life in love.
- 3.) Reclaim a life that is comprehensively characterized by Christlike love.
